Library Tutorials Information for Faculty

The Library has three tutorials that provide test results that students can share with their professors:

| <u>InfoPower</u> | InfoPower teaches students to identify the differences between primary and secondary sources; employ efficient database searching techniques, such as keyword and subject searches; learn how to find the full text of articles from a database; evaluate information in terms of currency, authority, accuracy, relevance, and purpose; and how to recognize and avoid plagiarism. This tutorial includes self-assessment quizzes in addition to the cumulative test at the end. It takes approximately 50 minutes to complete. It can be assigned in its entirety or by module: |
